

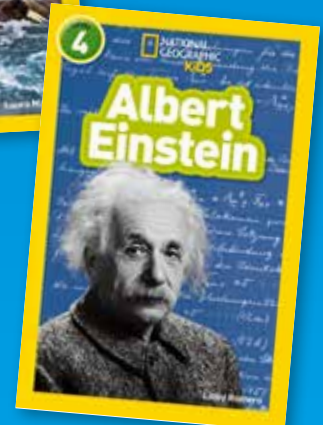

A few years later, Keller's mother read about a school for blind and deaf children. There, students learned how to finger-spell words into a person's hands. She wondered if her little girl could learn, too.

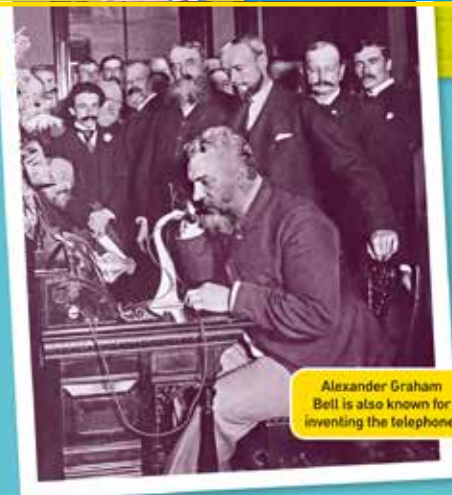
Words to Know
